What has Unity Club achieved in 2022/2023?



- NDU Integration Project in 20 higher learning institutions
- 29th Commemoration of the 1994 Genocide Against the Tutsi
- Integrated Community Development Project, ICDP, in Huye district
- Dissemination of the research done by Unity Club on the impact of 1994 Genocide against the Tutsi on the most affected youth in Rwanda; among others.







Sunday, October 29, 2023, at Intare Conference Arena, Unity Club held its 16th annual forum under the theme: "Ndi Umunyarwanda: Igitekerezo-ngenga cy'ukubaho kwacu", which means "Rwandanness, the core and prerequisite of our existence."

Present in the forum, were Unity Club members, senior officials from different government entities, youth reperesentatives, leaders from faith based organizations, civil society, among others, close to 400 delegates.





HOW FAR WITH ICDP PROJECT?



Huye: Houses for the needy are built in 4 together setup

21 out of 26 planned families have been settled through this project. 16 4Together houses were built in the last 6 months of 2023, in addition to another 4 built in the previous year, and another is under renovation.

Background and context of the project

Wherever Unity Club implements projects/programs, it makes sure surrounding communities also benefit directly or indirectly from its presence.

The Impinganzima Hostel in Huye immediate neighbors is an IDP model village housing other genocide survivors, a model village housing retired soldiers, Rwandans expelled from Tanzania, as well as communities that lived in Taba village before the Genocide against Tutsis.

The IDP model village inhabitants thought they should be taken care of the same way the elderlies are, but Unity Club wants to empower them so they can be responsible citizens. The inhabitants of Taba who lived there before the genocide feel left out and need mindset change regarding unity and reconciliation as well as empowerment to upgrade their livelihood.

It is in this regards that in 2021, Unity Club introduced the integrated community development project that carried out in Taba Village in Mukura Sector. It serves as a bridge to strengthen unity and reconciliation in the community while at the same time paving ways for smooth integration of the elderlies.

This "Integrated community Development Project, ICDP" has 2 components:

- 1. Upgrading Impinganzima Hostel.
- 2. Community Integration and Development.

Through the "ICDP" project, different infrustures will be built including the modern market which is under construction. It is also planned to build a multipurpose hall, different playgrounds for sports.




I ask everyone who lives near these parents to really keep an eye on them, and treat them as our own, because they need to send them a shelter to support them."
